The TCSPP community is deeply saddened by the tragic death of Tyre Nichols following a traffic stop on January 7th in Memphis, TN. The recently released video of this incident may be both triggering and traumatizing for many TCSPP community members. The reoccurring injustices that continue to occur in this country may leave our community shaken, confused, exhausted, and angry.

As current and future critical care providers, we appreciate the compassion and care you provide to all our communities during these crises.
