Presenter Information

You will create an electronic poster and record a narrative describing your research. For the narrative recording, the recording should be about 5-10 minutes (no longer than 15 minutes). For the electronic poster, you are able to use the TCSPP Poster Presentation Template and record a voiceover narrative in PowerPoint, or create your own presentation using PowerPoint, Prezi, or other tools.

Electronic posters must be uploaded to the GRF course in Canvas by (day), (month) (date) at (time) (time zone). When uploading your materials, please be sure to following the instructions below:

- Font size – 20pt. font and above
- Each presenter will create a new discussion in the Discussion Board section of the course.
- The discussion should be titled “[Your Name] – [Your Poster Title].”
- In the first post, upload your poster presentation and include your name, department, methodology (qualitative, quantitative, or mixed), stage of research (question, research in progress, completed), three keywords, and abstract.

Judges and members of the TCSPP community will be invited to ask questions and offer suggestions via comments on each thread. Comments will open at (time) (time zone) on (day), (month) (date). Presenters will be expected to monitor comments and respond within 48 hours through (day), (month) (date) at (time) (time zone).

Judges will conduct a final review of all presentations and discussions on (day), (month) (date) and will announce their decision via email and via the GRF course in Canvas by (time) (time zone) on (day, month and date – 5 days after event end, no later than 7 days). Prizes will be awarded to the first, second, and third place posters within the contest.



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
