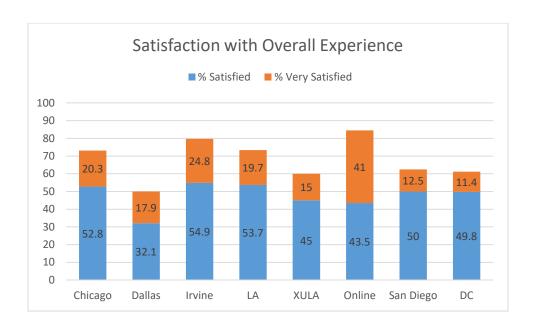
## Methodology

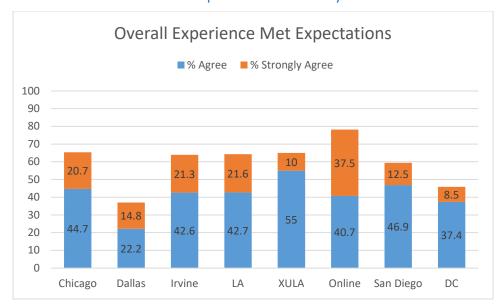

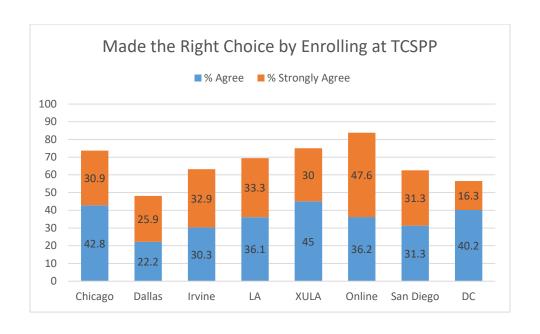

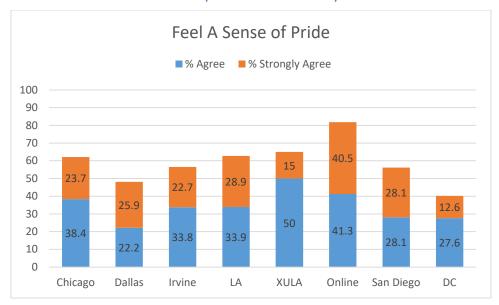
### Loyalty

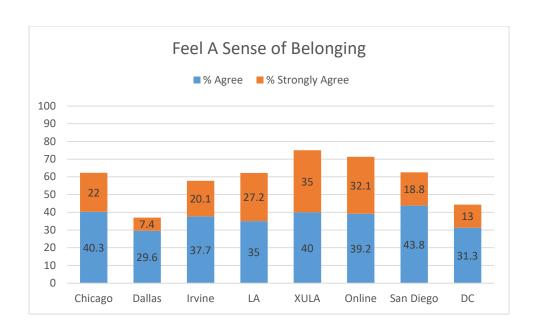

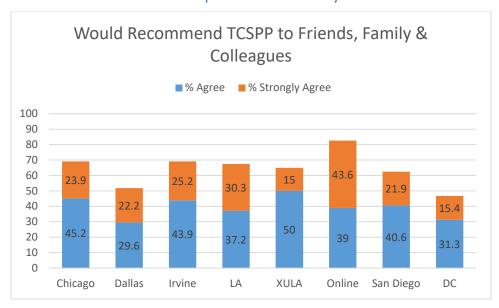






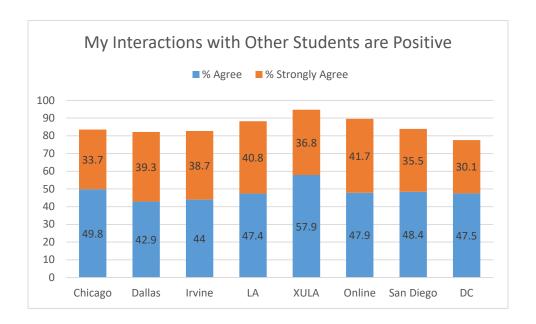


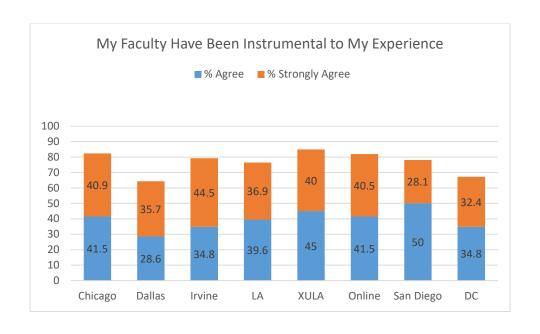


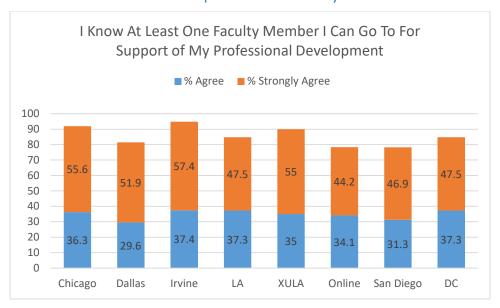


### Community

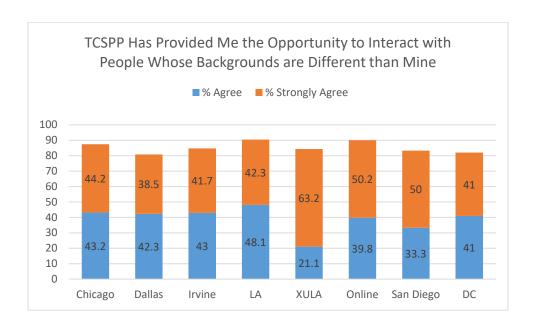


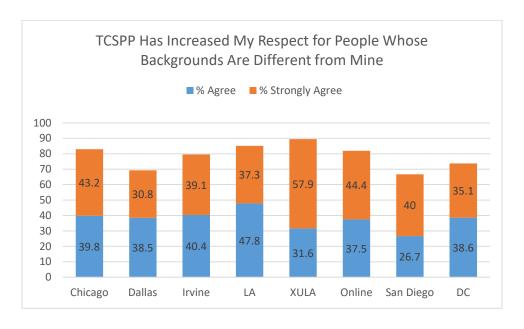

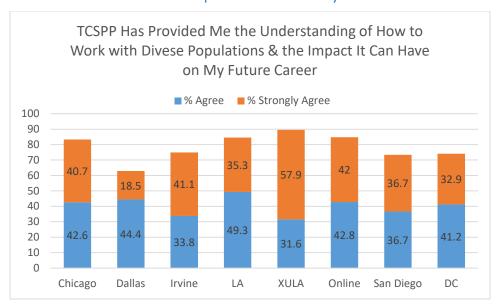
Academic Resources are defined as "e.g. academic assistance, lectures, presentations, campus writing centers."

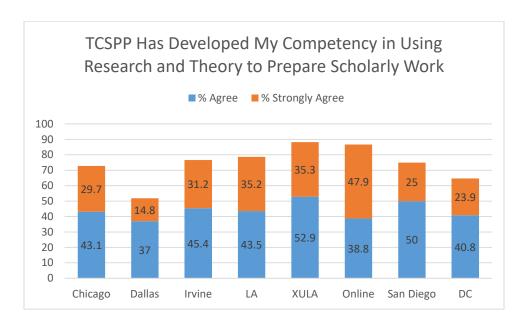


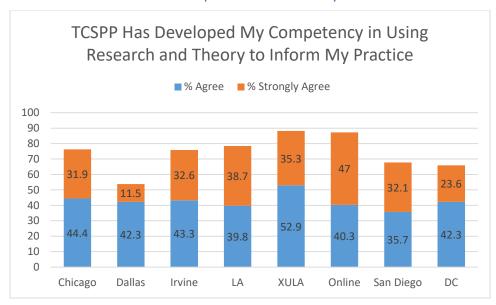


### Scholarship

TCSPP works to advance students' ability to apply research and theory to their scholarly work and practice. The SES asks respondents to comment on their experience related to these competencies.







#### Recommendations

The SES asks respondents to provide recommendations to improve TCSPP. The following are the major themes found in the qualitative responses.

#### Chicago

- Increased communication and transparency between administration (both upper level and departmental) and students
- Increased consistency across faculty regarding expectations, absence allowances (particularly when students are ill), and flexibility for personal circumstances
- Increased concern for mental health of students, including therapy/counseling needs that are not being met currently
- Increased community engagement, student life, and event opportunities outside of working hours, particularly for students in blended programs
- Increased diversity-related student life and event offerings
- Evaluation and revision of the IRB process

#### Dallas

- Increased communication and transparency between administration (both upper level and departmental) and students
- Increased programmatic information provided at admission
- Increased events and co-curricular offerings

#### Irvine

- Increased communication and transparency between administration (both upper level and departmental) and students
- Enhanced evaluation of faculty
- Increased on-ground co-curricular experiences
- Evaluation of parking offerings

### Los Angeles

- Increased communication and transparency between administration (both upper level and departmental) and students
- Increased event offerings outside of working hours, including weekends
- Increased opportunities for student engagement, especially within cohorts
- Enhanced evaluation of faculty

#### XULA

- Evaluation and revision of the IRB process
- Enhanced TCSPP support of the program/location

#### Online

- Increased communication and transparency between administration (both upper level and departmental) and students
- Increased opportunities for engagement
- Evaluation and revision of the IRB process

• Improved Canvas use – syllabus review/consistency, navigation, setup, etc.

### San Diego

- Increased resources for students on campus
- Evaluation of curriculum
- Evaluation of faculty

#### DC

- Increased communication and transparency between administration (both upper level and departmental) and students
- Increased dissertation supports
- Evaluation of faculty and department administration
- Increased professional development opportunities
- Increased course offerings
- Concerns around conflict between transfer students and current TCSPP students

### Conclusion

Based on the results outlined above, TCSPP has a good reputation amongst students. There are opportunities for improvement that have been recognized by survey respondents which, if addressed, may further increase students' experiences with the institution.
