TCSPP Resumes In-Person Instruction in Fall 2021!

There are some government restrictions and guidelines during this special time. Please review the information thoroughly and take an action accordingly. Information below is evolving and guidance can change at any time. At this time this information is what we have to date. Should it change, we will work with you to address changes.











When In-Person Instruction is resumed, you are required to report to your classes as prior to the Pandemic. Each campus might have minor course schedule adjustment per local government guidelines. Please follow the instruction from your campus leadership closely.

All regular policies and regulations for F1/J1 status are effective. Due to the evolving situation and unpredictability of the pandemic and related guidelines, we still recommend that you defer your travel plan. If you must travel, please review the following information thoroughly and notify your DSO right away.

For those of you who have returned home and plan to travel back in Fall 2021, please work closely with your DSO to activate your SEVIS record and consult with U.S. embassy and Consulate Office about visa renewal if needed.

Now you can file your OPT Application Online!

If you are applying for the following two type of OPT, you can now file online:

- (c)(3)(A) Student Pre-Completion OPT
- (c)(3)(B) Student Post-Completion OPT

You will be able to receive the Case Receipt No. immediately after submission and track your case progress online. Online application will avoid missing documents and wrong payment amount that might cause rejection.

You are required to <u>create an account</u> with USCIS prior to applying OPT online. Your DSO will go through the process with you. The paperwork required for Online Application is the same and currently the adjudication time is the same as file in paper when the goal is to reduce the time eventually.

Summer 2021 Course and SEVIS Registration

You should be registered for your courses for Summer 2021 at this time. Since we are continuing to offer all courses online, you will be in compliance as long as you enroll full time in Summer 2021. If you are not registered, please do so right away! The last day of Add/Drop for Summer 2021 is May 16, 2021. Your DSO cannot register you with SEVIS to keep your record Active until you are registered for courses at TCSPP. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your DSO or your Student Support Counselor.

OPT Application

If you are planning to graduate in Summer, it is time to work with your Department and DSO to prepare your OPT application. OPT processing time with USCIS can range from three to five months if not longer. Please see the required document checklist on our website and join the monthly OPT Workshop the second Tuesday every month. See calendar below at the end of the newsletter.

Summer 2021 Remote Operation

By now you should have received the COVID-19 School Operation update from your campus leadership regarding Summer 2021 semester. When the leadership is assessing all situations and consult with different levels of government agencies and COVID-19 evolvement, TCSPP is going to continue offering courses remotely for our on-ground students through Summer 2021 semester when certain classes might have in-person sessions. It will continue with Live videoconferencing – Synchronous (real-time) model.



Online vaccine scams: Homeland Security Investigations, INTERPOL issue public warning



Be vigilant, be skeptical, be safe

In the midst of on-going efforts to vaccinate the U.S. population against COVID-19, reports are surfacing about a scam targeting vulnerable consumers with promises of gifts and cash for taking a fraudulent post-vaccination survey. The reality is that these fraudulent surveys are used to unlawfully capture consumers' personal information and potential steal money from consumers.

2020 Federal Tax filing deadline has been extended until May 17, 2021!

Extension doesn't apply to State Tax and each state is different. Please check your state's update with your DSO. We still have quota left for the free filing <u>Code</u> for first 50 students to file Federal Tax (extra for State).




